Westland, MI (April 14, 2021) - On Monday, April 5, Mayor William R. Wild announced a drastic reduction of contaminated recycling loads following the city's comprehensive education efforts.

The City's recycling program was reinstated in July of 2020 after being suspended in 2019 due to increased processing costs. In the early months of the recycling program, the number of contaminated loads were concerning as the city was paying a penalty plus additional disposal fees. In September, a high of 56% of the city's 51 loads were rejected.

In November of 2020 the City of Westland launched a comprehensive education initiative which consisted of informational packets hand delivered to all residential households, social media, water bill inserts, and promotions on the City's cable station. Since these citywide educational efforts, Westland has

seen a significant drop in the percentage of contaminated loads to 9% or less in the last three months.

"As part of the City's strategy to improve recycling quality, the City of Westland has also established an interactive map which will allow the sanitation department to identify the routes of contaminated loads in order to identify which neighborhoods may require additional outreach," commented Mayor William R. Wild.

Since its inception in 2009, Westland's curbside recycling program has resulted in 100,000,000 pounds of processed recycling. For more information on the city's recycling program, visit www.cityofwestland.com.
