Westland to Establish Comprehensive Economic Development Strategic Plan; Seeks Community Input

Westland, MI (May 24, 2021) -The City of Westland is working to develop a formalized comprehensive Economic Development Strategic Plan. The goal of the economic development strategy is to identify initiatives and methods that will encourage diversity of the city's economic base, tap into opportunities for economic expansion and help to promote community wealth building. Development of a formalized Economic Development Strategic Plan is a requirement under the Michigan Economic Development Corporation's (MEDC) Redevelopment Ready Communities Program (RRC) and was identified as a priority for 2021 during strategic planning workshops with the City Council earlier this year.

In March, the City of Westland engaged with Bonner Advisory Group to assist with the creation of the strategic plan. The City received a grant from the Michigan Department of Treasury which will fund the project in its entirety.

The process for building the plan includes significant analytic research coupled with input obtained from the business community, residents, non-profit organizations and other key community stakeholders. In order to obtain this input, the City of Westland has developed a survey to gather insights and guide to plan formation.
