Westland Police Department to Host Two Neighborhood Safety Program Events

Westland, MI (July 6, 2021) The Westland Police Department has developed a new community policing initiative called the **Westland Police Neighborhood Safety Program**.

Working in partnership with neighborhood residents, the Westland Police Department will identify and resolve specific quality of life problems or concerns. In addition, this is a great opportunity for neighbors to meet each other while also meeting their City's police officers.

"Our Police Department kicked off the Neighborhood Safety Program in June at Stottlemeyer Park and we had a lot of great discussion and engagement from residents in the surrounding area," commented Mayor William R. Wild.

"Recognizing that every neighborhood has different concerns and public safety needs, we now move to tackle the concerns in other areas of the community."

With the cooperation of Westland residents, the Westland Police Department will be able to identify:

- Neighborhood Traffic Concerns
- Neighbor Disputes
- Vandalism
- Potential Drugs
- Thefts
- Safety Concerns
- *Police will provide* - Neighborhood Specific Crime Stats and Safety Tips

The next Neighborhood safety meeting will take place at **Voss Park** with a specific focus being on the neighborhoods south of Cherry Hill to Palmer and from Venoy east to Henry Ruff.

Voss Park – 30600 Palmer, Westland on Saturday July 17th at 10:00am.

Later this month, an addition meeting will take place at **Curtis Woods Park** with a specific focus on the neighborhoods south of Cherry Hill to Palmer and from Newburgh East to Wayne Road.

Curtis Woods Park – 36400 Palmer Rd, Westland on Saturday July 31st at 10:00am.

Mayor Wild, Police Chief Jeff Jedrusik and Westland's Community Police Team will be in attendance for both of these meetings.
