In response to power outages throughout the City of Westland and the dangerous heat and humidity, the City has opened several Cooling Centers that will also serve as Charging locations for residents phones or electronic devices today:

- Westland City Hall, located at 36300 Warren Road – until 5 p.m.
- Fire Station #1 located at 35701 Central City Parkway), until 8 p.m.
- Fire Station #3 located at 28801 Annapolis, until 8 p.m.
- The Police Station located at 36701 Ford Road) 24 hours
- The Friendship Center located at 1119 N. Newburgh Road, until 5 p.m.
- Jefferson Barns Community Vitality Center, located at 32150 Dorsey Road, until 5 p.m.
- William P. Faust Library, located at 6123 Central City Parkway until 9:00 p.m.
