## Westland Fire Department Launches Program to Aid Local Small Business

**Westland, MI (August 24, 2021)** -On Wednesday, August 25, the *Westland Fire Administration Public Awareness Committee* will host an official kickoff of their *Small Business Assistance Program*. The kickoff event will take place at 10:00 a.m. at the Ralph Savini Fire Station, located at 35701 Central City Parkway. The event will feature comments from Westland Mayor William R. Wild, Fire Chief James Morris, Fire Marshall Kelly Eggers, President and CEO of the Westland Chamber of Commerce Gretchen Heinicke and Westland business owners who will benefit from the newly implemented *Small Business Assistance Program*.

In June of 2020 The City of Westland implemented a small business grant program “*Westland CARES*” to assist struggling business owners and their employees. Mayor Wild’s “Compassionate City Initiative” together with Federal funds acquired under the CARES Act awarded forty-nine local businesses grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000 in order to help keep the doors open and their employees paid during the COVID-19 pandemic.

“The City of Westland Fire Department’s *Westland Fire Administration Public Awareness Committee* was dedicated to enhancing the administration’s efforts, to further assist these businesses,” commented Westland Fire Marshall, Kelly Eggers.

The nonprofit organization hosted a summer raffle raising \$10,000. The funds will be used to service the forty-nine businesses that were awarded grant monies as well as the community’s four bowling facilities fire safety components.

“These services can typically cost the business owners anywhere from a couple hundred dollars to several thousand dollars annually depending on the type of occupancy and their associated fire protection systems,” Fire Chief James Morris added.

“The COVID-19 virus has significantly impacted all of our lives this past year,” commented Mayor William R. Wild. “The statewide closings and government implemented restrictions have drastically affected the ability of small business owners to pay ongoing expenses.”

After the official kick off, the Public Awareness Committee will be servicing the occupancy's fire extinguishers, emergency exit lighting, and fire suppression systems making the businesses fire safe and code compliant for one year.

To make the raised dollars stretch, Fire Administration has teamed up with a local service provider Quality Fire.

"On behalf of the Westland Chamber of Commerce Members and the Westland Business Community, I would like to thank the City of Westland, Mayor Wild and his Administration, the Westland Fire Department and the Westland Community for their continued support of our Westland businesses, especially these past 17 months," commented Chamber CEO, Gretchen Heinicke.

"Westland is committed to continuing to assist our local business community through these difficult times and we are very grateful to the *Westland Fire Administration's Public Awareness Committee* for their compassion and support," Wild concluded.
