Westland Holds Inaugural Ceremony as Mayor and Four Council Members Take Oath of Office

Westland, MI (January 4, 2022) On Monday, January 3, 2022, the City of Westland formally inaugurated Mayor William R. Wild along with four members of city council.

The ceremony took place in the Gene McKinney Ballroom located inside Westland City Hall. Sworn in by 18th District Court Chief Judge Mark McConnell, Mayor William R. Wild will continue to serve as the city's Mayor. He has been serving our community as Mayor since 2007.

"It is an honor to continue to serve as Mayor of the All American city of Westland. I look forward to the next four years working closely with the City Council to improve the lives of Westland residents," says Mayor Wild.

The inaugural celebration also included swearing in for three current members of city council and one newcomer. James R. Godbout, first taking office in 2000; James Hart who first assumed office in 2018; Peter Herzberg in 2016 and the newly elected councilwoman Melissa Sampey, who officially took office January 1, 2022.

City Clerk Richard LeBlanc acted as the Masters of Ceremony with saxophonist Steven Thomas playing America the Beautiful. Reverend Dr. John E. Duckworth of Gethsemane Missionary Baptist Church kicked off the ceremony with an invocation. Mayor William R. Wild provided closing statements for the inaugural celebration.

Mayor Wild will serve a four year term along with Councilmen James Hart, James Godbout and Peter Herzberg. First-time elect Councilwoman Melissa Sampey will serve a two-year term.

"To the residents of the City of Westland, thank you for your continued support. Twenty-one years so far has been a pretty good run and I will continue to serve you and serve the best interest of all residents of the City of Westland," says Councilman James Godbout.

"We should all be active in the community some way or another. Sometimes that's on City Council; sometimes it's on boards and commission; sometimes it's your local civic groups. But I've always encouraged everybody to be active in any way they can and I've always encouraged my children to be active. If you guys hang around any city events, you'll always see some of my kids running around because they are just as bought into this and just as dedicated as I am," says Councilman James Hart.

"Over the last six years since being on Council, I've been able to learn so many things and really being in public service has been the most rewarding thing I've ever done and I enjoy it. I'm honored to do it and I'm looking forward to the next four years," says Councilman Peter Herzberg.

"I'm standing here as a brand new Councilwoman and many people said she can't and she won't do it. But it only takes one person to believe in you and I was very lucky I had so many people in my corner who believed in me and supported me," says Councilwoman Melissa Sampey.
