Payments can be made in person at **Westland City Hall, located at 36300 Warren Rd.**, during regular business hours. For added convenience, we have two-drop boxes available: one on the northeast side of the City Hall parking lot near the U.S. Postal Mailbox, and another in the wall slot just east of the City Hall main entrance. Human Trafficking Resources

The theme for Human Trafficking Prevention 2025 highlights the importance of a holistic approach to preventing human trafficking, recognizing its intersection with other forms of violence and social issues.

Connecting the dots between human trafficking, online harassment and abuse, interpersonal violence, and other forms of violence can disrupt multiple forms of exploitation. Understanding the role of economic mobility, desires for connection, technology, and market dynamics can prevent some of the most predictable recruitment schemes into human trafficking. Building healthy relationships and strengthening the resilience of communities and industries can protect against vulnerabilities to human trafficking.

We can address the root causes by decreasing known risks and increasing protective factors against trafficking.

This theme calls for collective action to strengthen prevention at every level—individual, relational, community, and societal. Our goal is to prevent exploitation before it occurs. It encourages cross-sector collaboration, including partnerships with individuals who have experienced trafficking. Together, we can strengthen our efforts to keep everyone safe from human trafficking.

About

Human trafficking is the use of force, fraud or coercion to control a person for the purpose of engaging in commercial sex acts or soliciting labor or services against their will. If the individual is under 18 years of age, force, fraud, or coercion need not be present, if engaging in commercial sex. Human trafficking is a crime under international and federal law and also the State of Michigan.

Warning Signs

Learn some of the warning signs of Human Trafficking

- Avoids eye contact and appears fearful
- Brags about making or having lots of money

- Cutting
- Displays expensive clothes, accessories or shoes
- Checked out, Depressed, Distracted or Withdrawn
- Evidence of mental or physical abuse
- Less appropriately dressed than before
- Multiple cell phones
- New tattoo (tattoos are often used as a way to brand victims. Tattoos of a barcode, money, name or symbol could indicate trafficking)
- New friends or older partner with a different lifestyle
- Overly tired in class
- Sexualized behavior
- Unexplained absences from class

How to Help

Speak Up if you see something suspicious

- Call 911 immediately, if you witness a trafficking situation

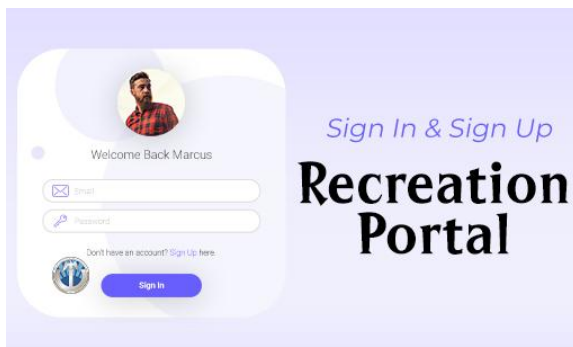

7 Common Items in Scams

- 1 A hostile phone call demanding payment within a short time frame.
- 2 Threaten service will be shut off the same day if payment is not made.
- 3 Insist on a specific form of payment, like a pre-paid credit card from a convenience store.
- 4 May seek personal or account information.
- 5 May have an account number or what sounds like the proper bill amount.
- 6 May "spoof" your phone, making it appear as if the call comes from Consumers Energy.
- 7 May provide an 800 or 888 number to call that is not ours.


What You Should Know



Do not pay over the phone using a pre-paid credit card.

Do not give personal information or money over the phone to anyone you do not know.

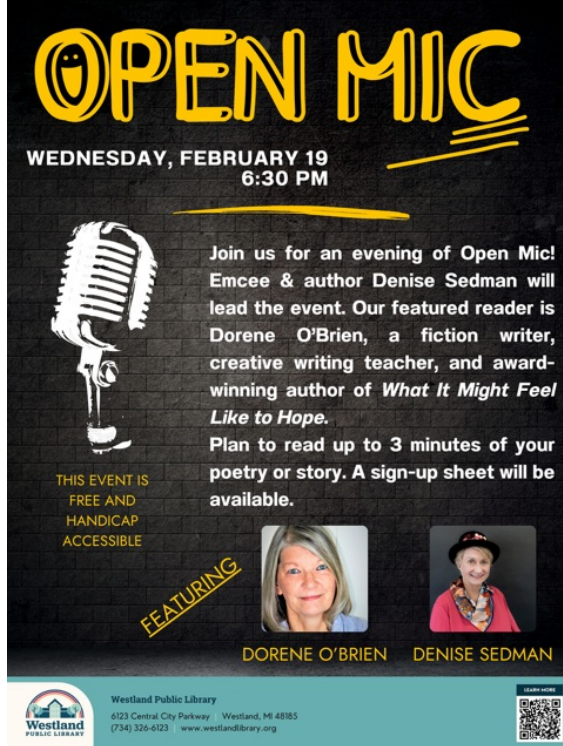

The legislative body of Westland is the City Council which consists of seven (7) Council persons, elected at large. Four Council persons are elected at each regular odd year City election. The three candidates receiving the highest number of votes are elected to four (4) year terms and the candidate receiving the fourth highest number of votes is elected to a two (2) year term. The term of office commences at 12:00 noon on January 1, following the election and expires at 12:00 noon two or four years thereafter.
